Policies to Power the UK's future

University Alliance is calling on the Government to enact the following policies to enhance universities' contribution to the national economic, social and cultural recovery

Jobs and skills



- 1. Ensure regulation does not hinder innovation and disincentive flexible modes of study.
- 2. Make higher technical provision more accessible and transparent. Explicitly brand programmes as preparation for progression within a particular technical route from level four to eight.
- **3.** Improve awareness of degree apprenticeships and make them more flexible. Unlock the Apprenticeships Levy to flexible and part-time earn-and-learn programmes.
- **4.** Level 6 and 7 apprenticeships should normally lead to degrees. Universities should ensure that the designation of the award shows it was achieved through the apprenticeship route (e.g., BScAppr)



Public sector workforce

- 5. Incentivise schools to offer increased placement opportunities for trainee teachers.
- **6. Increase capacity on nursing and allied health courses**. This could be achieved by increasing placement tariffs; increasing the use of simulation and virtual/augmented reality; and expanding placements beyond the NHS.

Research and Innovation



- 7. Reach the 2.4% R&D target by 2027. Ensure investment facilitates more places across the UK to fulfil their R&D potential and more opportunities for collaboration between universities and industry.
- 8. The UK Shared Prosperity Fund should be underpinned by a National Framework setting balance of funding to skills development, business support (particularly for SMEs) and research & innovation.
